**ABOUT THE BOOK:** *The Last Year* is not a hero's journey in pitch-deck form. It is the raw, unvarnished story of walking away from a \$200k+ salary, navigating emergency surgeries, and building two startups (SafetyVue & DealVue) while raising a family.

From coding on a rolling desk at 4:00 AM to negotiating "The Pact" at the kitchen table, this book documents the brutal reality of the "Valley of Death"—and the specific playbook used to survive it.

**MEET TIM WOLTER:** Tim Wolter is a builder, a survivor, and the founder of **AvantVue**. After walking away from a corporate career to build **SafetyVue** and **DealVue**, Tim navigated a brutal year of financial brinkmanship and health crises to lead his companies to be named one of **Louisville Business First's "2026 Startups to Watch."**

He currently serves as an **Entrepreneur in Residence at Amplify Louisville**, where he mentors the next generation of Kentucky founders.

# STORY ANGLES

## SUGGESTED STORY ANGLES

**1. THE "VALLEY OF DEATH" REALITY CHECK** Most Kentucky startups die quietly. Tim Wolter shares the 3 specific warning signs he saw as a COO that forced him to resign and pivot.

- **The Signal:** When AI started "eating the bottom out of the business" and projects shrank.
- **The Decision:** Why he chose to "take himself off the payroll" to save the company's runway.
- **The Lesson:** How to recognize when a business model is broken before the cash runs out.

**2. THE "MARRIAGE PACT" THAT SAVED THE COMPANY** Co-founding a company is hard; doing it with your spouse while raising three kids is harder. Tim and Chelsie Wolter created a "Kitchen Table Pact" with three non-negotiable rules:

- **Rule 1:** Separate business problems from marriage problems.
- **Rule 2:** Never weaponize the startup in arguments.
- **Rule 3:** The kids are never on the hook for the parents' risk.

**3. THE "COUCH BOSS": PARENTING WHILE BUILDING** We talk about "hustle," but we don't talk about the reality of coding while a sick toddler sleeps on the couch next to you.

- **The Reality:** Working at 3:17 A.M. with a sick child ("The Couch Boss") and an investor demanding data room files.
- **The Strategy:** How to handle investor calls without hiding your family life—and why transparency actually builds trust.

**4. THE PIVOT: FROM "RE: DATA ROOM" TO "STARTUP TO WATCH"** The story of how a frustrating email from an investor birthed a new company.

- **The Spark:** Tim realized the tools he needed to survive due diligence didn't exist.
- **The Build:** Coding **DealVue** from a rolling desk after emergency surgery because he couldn't sit in a chair.
- **The Result:** Turning a personal pain point into a product that landed him on the "Startups to Watch" list.
